NLI Launches Safer Skies Portal



In honor of the victims of the Dana air accident, of June 3, 2012, NLI embarked on a Safer Skies Initiative. The project is an act of solidarity to the families of the victims and a way of protecting the living who still undertake air travels in Nigeria. On June 3, 2014, the second-year remembrance of the Dana victims, NLI formally launched the Safer Skies web portal –one of the five components of the Safer Skies Initiative. NLI's October 2013 Associate Fellows undertook the development of the portal as its class project.

The portal is accessible at: <u>www.saferskiesng.org.</u>

The Safer Skies Initiative aims primarily at reducing avoidable aviation accidents and restoring confidence in the Nigerian aviation sector. Further, the Initiative hopes to contribute to improved accountability as passengers and citizens can comment on their travel experiences, obtain historical and current information on airline operators and ages of their aircrafts, recently reported incidents. Subject matter experts can also present industry insights and analyses of trends.

The portal provides a platform for government officials and industry regulators to present official statements while citizens can anonymously upload useful information. An opportunity also exists to electronically sign a petition in support of safer skies in Nigeria.

Air operators are offered a forum to provide information and/or clarifications on reported issues. Air regulators, in turn, have the opportunity to monitor reported incidences for necessary action if warranted.

Speaking at the launch of the Safer Skies Portal NLI's CEO Yinka Oyinlola informed that "since the first air accident in Nigeria, in 1969, there have been 54 others for reasons such as poorly maintained aircrafts and runways, poor communication equipment and lack of infrastructure, non-functional radar, ineffective regulatory oversight, etc. It is indeed unacceptable that in the last 10 years, a total of 624 people have lost their lives from ten air crashes in Nigeria while a country like South Africa has only had two air crashes during the same timeframe."

The Nigeria Leadership Initiative (NLI), together with its partner, the Initiative for Global Development (IGD), co-hosted the 10th Frontier 100 Forum from May 5-6 in Abuja. The Forum brought together an influential network of global corporate executives. The goal was to encourage partnerships and investments that support economic growth and development. NLI highlighted the key talent and government partnerships, available in Nigeria, by inviting 14 of the Discussion Leaders and guests to the event. NLI alumni availed the opportunity to expand their network with the Forum participants which comprised of 50 CEOs and senior executives from Africa. The participants engaged in a number of focused discussions with the overall objective of increasing investment and business growth in Africa. NLI reported Alumni surveyed substantive connections and concrete discussions with their peers as a result of attending the event.

NLI commences a Fellows Program

Over the years, NLI has successfully established and sustainably executed two distinct programs for its network members: the Associate Fellows program and the Senior Fellows program.

Early in 2014, NLI saw the need to have a new program that will cater for Associate Fellows who have demonstrated impact and are at an inflection point as influencers in key leadership positions and consequently now require a program that will enable them to further move from success to significance. So the idea for an NLI Fellows program was born in the first quarter of 2014.

The first class of NLI Fellows is now scheduled to take place in mid-August 2014 in conjunction with NLI's partner, YALE University. NLI, working with Yale has developed a curriculum for the Fellows Seminar that logically builds on the Future Leaders Seminar.

The Fellows seminar will focus on high-impact leadership for a better society. The seminar modules will focus on leadership, negotiation, and impact assessment. The program will run for six days and will be facilitated by Yale Faculty. The delivery method will include presentations, project-oriented workshops, discussion, and possibly field trips – the intent is for an intensive and interactive program that gives value for money and time. Each Fellows Class will comprise of a cohort of 25 people drawn from the 2007-2009 NLI Associates Class. NLI is, therefore, pleased to invite qualified Associate Fellows to participate in the first class of NLI Fellows Seminar at Yale campus in New Haven, Connecticut, US.
